Tour Itinerary

Day 1 : Arrival in Quito



Your journey begins in Quito, where you'll be warmly welcomed upon arrival and transferred to your hotel. After the journey, enjoy a relaxed evening and a shared dinner, giving you time to settle in, rest, and prepare for the days of discovery ahead. Overnight in a comfortable 4-5 star hotel.

Day 2 : Aroma Cacao Center & City Tour



In the afternoon, step into Quito's historic center, a UNESCO World Heritage Site rich with art, faith, and history. Wander through Independence Square, admire the intricate beauty of La Compañía de Jesús, explore San Francisco Church and Convent, stroll along the charming streets of La Ronda, and take in sweeping views of the city from El Panecillo. Return to your hotel for dinner and rest.

Day 3 : Misahuallí RFCx Tour



Leaving the Andes behind, you travel east toward the Amazon basin, arriving in Misahuallí near Tena, where the landscape shifts dramatically into lush rainforest. Upon arrival at Ceibos Lodge, you'll be introduced to Rainforest Connection (RFCx) and Arbimon, learning how sound is used to protect ecosystems.

Day 3 : Misahuallí RFCx Tour



Visit an active Guardian site deep in the forest, witness a live Guardian device demonstration, and participate in a guided listening session using real field recordings that reveal the hidden rhythms of the rainforest. Optional tree-climbing demonstrations offer a unique perspective of the canopy above. The evening is spent at Ceibos Lodge, surrounded by the sounds of the jungle.

Day 4 : Exploring Ceibos Lodge Reserve with Rainforest Connection



The day is dedicated to exploring the Ceibos Lodge Reserve alongside the Rainforest Connection team. Guided walks introduce you to towering ceibo trees, dense understory, and the complex web of life that thrives here. Each guest receives a curated collection of audio highlights captured during the trip, offering a lasting connection to the forest you've explored.

As night falls, enjoy a Cultural Night that celebrates local traditions through music, storytelling, and shared experiences, deepening your understanding of life in the Amazon.

Day 5 : Great Ceibo Trail & Tubing



The morning begins on the Great Ceibo Trail, where ancient trees, medicinal plants, and wildlife reveal themselves along the path. Guides share stories of the forest's healing traditions and ecological importance.

In the afternoon, float gently along the Pusuno River during a guided tubing experience, taking in the rainforest from the water's edge.

After nightfall, head out on a guided night walk to discover nocturnal species that only emerge after dark, offering an entirely different perspective of the jungle.

Day 6 : Amazonian Wildlife & Kichwa Community



A motorized canoe carries you along the Napo River, opening the door to Amazonian wildlife and conservation efforts. Visit El Amazónico Wildlife Rescue Center, home to ocelots, tapirs, parrots, and macaws, and learn about rehabilitation and protection initiatives.

Continue on to Anaconda Island and Caiman Lagoon before sharing lunch with a Kichwa community. Here, you'll experience traditional food, rituals, and hands-on activities such as blowgun practice. The day concludes with a visit to Ahuano town, where pottery-making and gold-panning traditions are still alive.

Day 7 : Waterfalls & Adventure Trails



Wake early for sunrise birdwatching, when the rainforest hums with life. Today's adventures are flexible: choose from scenic hikes leading to waterfalls, hidden canyons, and natural pools—ranging from gentle walks to more challenging treks.

Paddle quietly through the Kawana Wildlife Lagoon, often called "Little Yasuní," before returning to the lodge. As evening falls, gather around a farewell bonfire, sharing stories beneath the Amazon sky.

Day 7 : Rayu Cocha Canyon



Follow ancient forest trails on a guided hike through Alto Pusuno, leading to a hidden waterfall tucked deep within the rainforest. This medium-difficulty walk offers a rewarding mix of adventure and immersion in the surrounding landscape. The hike is of medium difficulty and offers a memorable, high-adrenaline experience.

Day 7 : Rumi Yaku Waterfall



Follow a forest trail that winds past several small waterfalls, offering opportunities to observe the wildlife and plant life of the primary rainforest along the way.

Day 7 : Great Canyon of Ñachiyaku



This trail leads through the Great Canyon of Ñachiyaku, passing three waterfalls, including one hidden inside a cave. For those seeking an added thrill, there is the option to climb the waterfall and jump approximately eight meters into a natural pool. The hike is of medium difficulty and offers a memorable, high-adrenaline experience.

Day 7 : Umbuni Waterfall



The trail leads to a picturesque waterfall with a natural pool at its base, offering the chance to swim, jump in, or enjoy gentle rock slides. The route is of easy difficulty and ideal for a relaxed outing.

Day 8 : Chocolate Making & Farewell



On your penultimate day, take part in an artisanal chocolate-making experience and fruit tasting, celebrating the flavors of the Amazon one last time. After lunch, return to Quito, where the evening is reserved for a final dinner and overnight stay, offering time to reflect on the journey.

Day 9 : Departure to Airport

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your onward journey, carrying with you the sounds, stories, and spirit of the Ecuadorian Amazon.
